- When did it happen? Administered in SVUSD in March 2019 & December 2020. Next administration is December 2021.
- Who participated? 2,222 students in grades 3 12 (80%) / 985 families (28%) / 357 Staff members (71%)

Focus Question: "Overall, how do you feel about your life?"

Grade Span	Average Rating	National Percentile Ranking
Elementary School	2.52 out of 3	48th
Middle School	3.83 out of 5	66th
High School	3.29 out of 5	9th

- Use YouthTruth data to refine existing & new partnerships with community-based organizations to bridge gaps in resources and services.






Do you think your teacher wants you to work your hardest?


I take pride in my school work.

- O My teachers give me assignments that really help me learn.


High School


Does the work you do for class make you really think?



Elementary School


- O Do you like the way your teacher treats you when you need help?

- How many of your teachers are not just satisfied if you pass, they care if you're really learning?






