





My Dad was in the Marines in 1955 and is a Marine to this day!




Captain Thomas Stanton
My father in 1967 with an unnamed South Vietnamese soldier.




Carl Boger






Dorothy L. (Bancroft) Hammett



Dental assistant in the Navy.




Eloy Gonzales




Eugene Frediani
Dad was a mechanic in the U.S. Army Air Corps (which later became the Air Force). I believe this photo was taken in 1944.




Frank Mancuso



Harold J. Pennington


My Dad took great pride in serving his country. He joined the US Marine corp at the age of 17. He was a paratrooper.
